Your student is being charged for their breakfast and lunches this year unless you apply *and* qualify for the district Free/Reduced Lunch program. It is never too late to apply for Free/Reduced Lunches. *IF* you qualify for the program your school fees can also be waived. You must click on the box to share the information with the school in order for them to waive your school fees. (fines are not waived through this process). You can apply for the program through your parent portal account or through the school cafe account.

#### **ALL 5TH GRADE PARENTS**

Hello Elementary Band & Orchestra Families,

I hope that you have had a great summer. We are excited to get started with a new year and working with your students. Here are the details for the elementary band and orchestra this year.

**1.** We presented to all of the 5<sup>th</sup> graders the possible instruments your child can choose in the next couple of weeks. Instrument changes are strongly discouraged during the year so please think carefully about the instrument your child would like to play for the entire year. The options are:

**Band:** Flute, Clarinet, Trumpet, Trombone, Percussion

Orchestra: Violin, Viola, Cello, Bass

2. What is your instrument plan? After our presentation, a google form will be emailed to every family. Please complete this form so we know how best to prepare an instrument for your child. The best way to get your instrument is by renting one from a local music store. These instruments will be brand new and the monthly rental cost will go toward purchasing the instrument. Many good used instruments are also available, but any used instrument should be inspected by a music repair shop first to make sure it is in playable condition. A poor quality instrument can discourage a beginning student very quickly. Please don't let this happen to your child! A LIMITED number of school owned instruments are available to use at a fee of \$62.50/semester (\$125/year). These fees are not charged to students who qualify for free or reduced lunch.

Instrument Rental and Information night will be on **9/1 from 5:30-7pm at Creighton Middle School.** If you are unable to attend, below are some music stores we suggest you contact in order to rent your instrument. Please contact us if you have questions.

**3.** Music Book: Band will be using "Essential Elements Book #1 for Band". Orchestra will be using "Essential Elements Book #1 for Orchestra". These books cost only \$10 and will be written in and used the entire school year. Our music vendors will have the book information.

- 4. First day of class: Classes start the week of September 12<sup>th</sup>
- **5.** Days of rehearsal: Since we only get to see students twice every week, it is **IMPERATIVE for students to remember** their instrument and music books. Rehearsals are during the school day. Below is the daily schedule.

#### WARM WEATHER ATTIRE
