PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Glennon Heights Families,

It finally looks like autumn is upon us. Leaves are falling, the weather is getting colder, and our lost and found is filling up. While I say that in jest, there is truth to that statement. Due to the time of year with the weather being more erratic, please make sure that your child has appropriate attire for outside recess. We want the students to be outside for recess to get fresh air, exercise, and have a much needed and desired break. Please label your students' jackets, hats, and gloves with their names.

Over the last few months, we have had two Community Conversations held at the school, an FCB Committee composed of both Belmar and Glennon staff and parents, and tonight, on 10/26, we will have a Public Hearing at Jefferson High School from 7:30-8:30 pm. Then on November 10th, the District Board of Education will vote on school closures. While I feel that the Board will ultimately pass this vote and close Glennon Heights as well as the 15 other elementary schools, for the 23-24 school year, I want to let you know that we will continue to have your child's needs at the forefront of what we do here. If this vote is passed, there will be an Enrollment Specialist that will reach out to you to speak about options that you and your family have for enrollment next year. I also want to thank everyone for the outpouring of support that I have heard in the last few months. This is a very special school mostly due to the people!

Also, a special thanks to two of our parents, Sarah McNew and Kathy Williams for their participation in the FCB Committee. Yesterday, we met with two of our teachers, Vanessa Ulibarri and Susan Linze, as well as two Belmar Elementary PTA members to collaboratively compose a report to the Board focused on the challenges and opportunities that this potential closure can bring.

HALLOWEEN REMINDERS

Parents, please be sure to join us for our annual Halloween Parade on Monday, October 31st. The parade will begin at 1:45; the weather will determine the route. In lieu of class parties, there will be Monster Mash/Trunk or Treat immediately following the parade in the staff parking lot and on the grounds to the east of the school. Families must check out their student/s with their teacher from the classroom before attending the Monster Mash. Parents who are not able to attend can pick up their student from the Monster Mash or teachers will make sure they get on their usual after school daycare bus at 2:30. Here are some things to keep in mind as you and your children shop for those Halloween costumes:

- Costumes should be simple enough for students to be able to dress themselves and go over their clothes
- They should not be revealing in any way
- Inappropriate costumes with alcohol, tobacco, or gang imitations are not allowed
- Pretend weapons including swords knives and guns are not allowed
- Blood, gore, violent attire is not allowed
- The school has the discretion to ask any student to change into their school attire if there are issues with the costume that is detrimental to them and their peers.

Please remember that students are NOT to wear their costumes or face paint to school. They will be given time to dress in their costumes before the parade begins.



Please see the guidelines below for calling in your child from school. It is so important for them to be here consistently in their classrooms. If possible, please schedule appointments outside of school hours. Also, as a reminder, the tardy bell rings at 7:45 am. If you could please make sure your student is here on time and ready to learn,

Reasons to keep sick children at home:

- -The child does not feel well enough to take part in usual activities
- -Symptoms or illness including but not limited to fever, severe cough, vomiting, cold or flu-like symptoms, and Strep Throat

FREE/REDUCED LUNCH

The grace period for student lunches ended on September 28th. If you have not applied and been accepted for the free/reduced lunch program your student will be charged accordingly.

It is never too late to apply for the program, and the district just changed the Federal Eligibility requirements, meaning if you didn't qualify before, you may qualify now. You must click on the box to share the information with the school in order for your school fees to also be waived (fines are not waived through this process). You can apply for the program through your <u>parent portal</u> account or through the school cafe account.

Work first, THEN play.


- I do the things that I HAVE to do before I get to do the things that I WANT to do.
